RESOLUTION NO. 2017-R-16**

RESOLUTION DECLARING THE NECESSITY TO LEVY AN INCREASE OF A TAX IN EXCESS OF THE TEN-MILL LIMITATION IN THE VILLAGE OF LINCOLN HEIGHTS, HAMILTON COUNTY, OHIO FOR THE PROVISION AND MAINTENANCE OF MOTOR VEHICLES, COMMUNICATIONS, OTHER EQUIPMENT, BUILDINGS, AND SITES FOR SUCH BUILDINGS USED DIRECTLY IN THE OPERATION OF THE POLICE DEPARTMENT, OR THE PAYMENT OF SALARIES OF PERMANENT POLICE PERSONNEL, INCLUDING THE PAYMENT OF THE POLICE OFFICER EMPLOYER'S CONTRIBUTION AND REQUESTING THE COUNTY AUDITOR TO CERTIFY MATTERS IN CONNECTION THEREWITH

WHEREAS, The Village of Lincoln Heights has determined it is necessary to place a question on the November 2017 ballot for the purpose of increasing a tax levy for the provision and maintenance of motor vehicles, communications, other equipment, buildings, and sites for such buildings used directly in the operation of a police department, or the payment of salaries of permanent police personnel, including the payment of the police officer employer's contribution required under section 742.33 of the Revised Code; and

WHEREAS, The Village has determined that an increase of 4.00 mills in excess of the existing levy for each one dollar of valuation would be an appropriate replacement for the provision and maintenance of motor vehicles, communications, other equipment, buildings, and sites for such buildings used directly in the operation of a police department, or the payment of salaries of permanent police personnel, including the payment of the police officer employer's contribution required under section 742.33 of the Revised Code.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council for the Village of Lincoln Heights, Hamilton County, Ohio as follows:

SECTION I It is hereby declared that the amount of taxes which may be raised in the Village of Lincoln Heights within the ten-mill limitation by levies on the current tax duplicate will be insufficient to provide an adequate amount for the provision and maintenance of motor vehicles, communications, other equipment, buildings, and sites for such buildings used directly in the operation of a police department, or the payment of salaries of permanent police personnel, including the payment of the police officer employer's contribution required under section 742.33 of the Revised Code in the Village.

SECTION II

Pursuant to the provisions of Ohio Revised Code 5705.19(J), it is necessary to increase the levy currently existing, that is in excess of the ten-mill limitation, for the provision and maintenance of motor vehicles, communications, other equipment, buildings, and sites for such buildings used directly in the operation of a police department, or the payment of salaries of permanent police personnel, including the payment of the police officer employers' contribution required under section 742.33 of the Revised Code, an additional 4.00 mills for each one dollar (\$1.00) of valuation for a continuing period of time beginning January 1, 2018.

SECTION III

The question of the adoption of said tax levy increase shall be submitted to the electors of the Village of Lincoln Heights at the election to be held on November 7, 2017. If approved by a majority of the electors voting at such election, the tax levy increase shall first be placed upon the 2017 tax list and duplicate for first collection in the calendar year 2018.


SECTION IV

The Clerk is hereby directed to certify a copy of this Resolution to the County Auditor at the earliest possible time so that the County Auditor may certify such matters in accordance with Ohio Revised Code 5705.03 to be able to consider, pass and file a Resolution of Tax Levy for consideration at the November 2017 general election.

SECTION V


