RESOLUTION NO. 2019-R-7**

**RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE VILLAGE MANAGER TO APPLY
FOR A SAFE ROUTE TO SCHOOL GRANT**

WHEREAS, the United States Congress has set aside monies ("Funds") for Safe Routes to School Projects ("STRS");

WHEREAS, the Funds are available through the State of Ohio, Department of Transportation ("ODOT");

WHEREAS, Local Public Agencies ("LPA") can apply for STRS Funds and be selected for funding by ODOT;

WHEREAS, the Village of Lincoln Heights, Hamilton County, Ohio qualifies as a LPA;

WHEREAS, infrastructure improvements such as lighting, curb cut-outs, enhancing pathways, and creating crosswalks ("Project") is a transportation activity eligible to receive federal funding.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council for the Village of Lincoln Heights, Hamilton County, Ohio, that:

SECTION I. The Village Manager is hereby authorized to prepare and execute on behalf of the Village an Application for STRS Funds for the Project and submit the same to ODOT.

SECTION II. The total cost of the Project is estimated to be \$400,000, of which the Village, if awarded the STRS Funds, agrees to pay One Hundred Percent (100%) of the construction costs over and above the maximum amount provided by the ODOT.

SECTION III. Upon completion of the Project, and unless otherwise agreed, the Village shall:
(1) provide adequate maintenance for the Project in accordance with all applicable state and federal laws, including, but not limited to, 23 U.S.C. §116;
(2) provide ample financial provisions, as necessary, for the maintenance of the Project; (3) if necessary, maintain the right-of-way, keeping it free of obstructions; and (4) if necessary, hold said right-of-way inviolate for public highway purposes.

SECTION IV. If the application is approved for the STRS Funds the Village Manager is hereby empowered on behalf of the Village to enter into a contract with the Director of ODOT necessary to complete the above Project.

SECTION V. This Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the health, safety and general welfare of the Village of Lincoln Heights. The reason for said emergency is the need to pass this Resolution and have it take effect in time to meet the Safe Route to School Application deadline.
